
PURPOSE OF PHASE 1 NEEDS ASSESSMENT

- To evaluate the <u>functional and operational deficiencies</u> of existing Law Enforcement facility
- To forecast the estimated <u>number of beds</u> needed to serve Webster County's projected jail populations for 20-30 years
 - To provide an inmate forecast based upon a 'County Only' approach
 - To provide an inmate forecast based upon a 'More Regional' approach
- To provide an <u>initial range of budget</u> estimates for a New Justice Center (Sheriff's Office, County Jail, and Courtroom facility) based upon the 20-30 year inmate forecast and needs of the county judicial system




- Webster County's current population is 3,812 (2010 Census)

- Projected 0.69% Average Annual Decrease








• 2000-2010 Urban Centers absorb Rural Population














NATIONAL ARREST DATA ANALYSIS













 - Peak Population Capacity Modifier






AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION – PEAK CAPACITY FACTOR






Average Daily Population (ADP):












- '80% Rule of Thumb' for Classification: 20 yrs.=13 Beds & 30 yrs.= 14 Beds
- 1-2 'Turn-Away Inmates': 20 yrs.=15 Beds & 30 yrs.= 16 Beds
- 'Regional' Facility Approach (with Peak Available Adams Co. Inmates)
- Forecasted Capacity: 20 yrs.=21 Beds & 30 yrs.= 23 Beds
- '80% Rule of Thumb': 20 yrs.=26 Beds & 30 yrs.= 29 Beds
- 'Regional' Forecast Recommendation: <u>30 yrs.= 20 Beds</u>

Project Construction Cost vs. Lifetime Facility Operational Expense

- Jail project costs are generally 10% the lifetime facility operation expense
- Operational Expenses (Staff, Equipment, Repair, etc.) is 80% of the lifetime expense

Operational Expense with the Recommended Facility Sizes


- Both 'Regional' and 'Local' Recommendations maintain current staffing levels
- A more efficient staff-to-inmate ratio is achieved as the jail grows to 15 to 20 beds
- A larger facility would greatly prevent the transport of overflow inmates
- The need for transport staff is greatly reduce deputies increase patrol focus

OPTION 1 – Addition to the Historic Webster County Courthouse (New Sheriff's Office, Jail, and Courtroom Spaces)

OPTION 2 – Build a new Justice Center on "greenfield" site (New Sheriff's Office, Jail, and Courtroom Spaces)

OPTION 3 – Hold & Transport: keep "status quo" & continue to transport excess/non-classifiable inmates to other Counties at increasing costs
