Motion was made by Mans, seconded by Karr to approve minutes of the August 5, 2025, meeting. Voting in favor: Shipman, Ratzlaff, Gilbert, Mans and Karr. Voting nay, absent or abstaining: None. Motion was made by Karr, seconded by Ratzlaff to pay claims and payroll for the August 19, 2025, meeting. Voting in favor: Shipman, Ratzlaff, Gilbert, Mans and Karr. Voting nay, absent or abstaining: None.

At 8:35am, Road Superintendent, Paul Stoner met with the board. Paul presented the annual certification form between the State of Nebraska DOT and Webster County for the annual buyback. The board reviewed and signed this. Paul then gave an update on projects and equipment issues.

At 9:00am, the board discussed repairs needed on the stairway walls, cleaning up the courthouse parking lot and auction items from the courthouse and sheriff's office.

At 9:15am, Assessor Tami Scheuneman met with the board to present the contract with Standard Appraisal Services, Inc. The board reviewed and discussed this. A motion was made by Ratzlaff, seconded by Gilber to approve this contract. Voting in favor: Shipman, Ratzlaff, Gilbert, Mans and Karr. Voting nay, absent or abstaining: None.

At 9:20am, County Clerk Abbey Harig met with the board to discuss a date for the Joint Public Hearing. The board decided on Monday, September 22nd, 2025, at 6:00pm at the Red Cloud High School.

At 9:30am, NACOs Deputy Director, Candace Merideth met with the board. Candance discussed the upcoming joint public hearings, budget changes and the official's salary study. Candance also discussed a budget tool called GFOA Risk model that has great tools for budgeting, some upcoming legislative issues and future changes to licensing motor vehicles.

At 9:45am, Nebraska Extension Office Manager, Alexa Pedersen met with the board to discuss lighting issues on the first floor. People have complained about it being too dark to see the plaques and memorials on the walls. The second floor also has lighting issues out in the hall. After discussion, the board decided to have Energized Electric look at installing lights in the areas needed throughout the courthouse.

At 10:00am, Dustin Gay with Energized Electric met with the board to discuss HVAC issues and concerns. Many businesses have or have had issues with this system. Between the original company of this system going out of business and having to get parts from overseas, it can be very difficult to fix things in a timely manner. Discussion of a backup heat source was discussed. More discussion on starting to budget for a new system will be had in the future.

At 10:30am, Noxious Weed Superintendent, Brian Pedersen met with the board. Brian gave the board an update on Twin Valley and RC&D, grants, spraying on the river and phragmites spraying. Brian also went over important upcoming dates.

At 10:55am, Commissioner Shipman discussed seating in the courtroom. Discussion was had to go back to the pews that were originally in the courtroom. He found ten thirteen foot pews in Omaha that can be delivered. The delivery company requires 25% down upfront. The board approved using the county credit card to pay this. A motion was made by Karr, seconded by Mans to approve this purchase and the use of the credit card for delivery. Voting in favor: Shipman, Ratzlaff, Gilbert, Mans and Karr. Voting nay, absent or abstaining: None. The board then went upstairs to the courtroom to make sure the measurements would work. Dan will get Abbey all the information to line this up.
